**SUBJECT:** Operations and Maintenance Division Update

**PRESENTER:** Caine Camarillo, Supervising Ranger

**REPORT:** Ranger Staff is still working to finish critical items at Palo Corona Regional Park (Rancho Canada Unit) including signage, gates, utility improvements, alarms, equipment relocation, mowing, trail construction, facility maintenance, and much more. At the same time, Rangers are now patrolling trails to enforce rules and educate the public on the regulations associated with the new addition (dogs on leash, bikes, etc.). In addition to Garland Park and other Park District properties, this is the busiest that our parks have ever been. To address this need, Ranger Staff has transitioned to having 2 Rangers work each weekend and holiday, which means less staff to complete project work during the week.

Staff recently took possession of the additional AED units purchased through Tyler Heart Institute. All MPRPD Staff attended an in-service training to learn how to properly use an AED. Each MPRPD Ranger/EECO vehicle will now be equipped with an AED, as well as the Garland Park Visitor Center, Ranger Station, and the Palo Corona Regional Park Discovery Center.

The PCRPD Road Slide Repair Project is set to begin on September 4, 2018. Blaze Engineering was awarded the contract at the July Board Meeting and expects to complete the project by the end of September before the rainy season begins.

The dilapidated spectator bleachers at the Dedampierre ballfields have been replaced. The old bleachers did not meet Americans with Disabilities Act requirements. The new bleachers are made of aluminum and comply with ADA.
